Today, they are among the most significant developments in the legal services market, attracting interest from law firms, investors, regulators, and ethics counsel alike. This program examines major developments in the law firm/MSO landscape over the past year, including legislative and regulatory activity, evolving market trends, and the ethics questions arising from increasingly sophisticated transactions. Topics include lawyer independence, fee-sharing concerns, governance structures, conflicts, confidentiality, client communications, and emerging enforcement risks. 10:30 – 11:45 a.m. <i>Hemingway (11th Floor)</i>	SESSION SIX: The ‘Oh-No’ Plan: Proactive Continuity & Successor Counsel Planning for Solos & Small Firms <i>Succession planning is not just about retirement; it is about what happens when a solo or small firm lawyer is suddenly unavailable due to death, serious injury, incapacity, or even a disciplinary suspension. Larger firms often have management infrastructure and contractual guardrails in place. Solos and small firms, by contrast, are frequently caught off guard leaving clients’ matters at risk and families or staff scrambling to figure out what to do next. This program focuses on the “practice continuity” plan every small practice should have - designating a competent successor (or assisting) attorney and putting the arrangement in writing. We will walk through what that agreement should cover, including authority to notify clients, take possession of inventory files, and obtain time-sensitive access needed to protect client interests along with practical considerations like compensation and cost reimbursement. Further, because client relationships and confidentiality obligations do not disappear in an emergency, we will also address when and how client consultation/consent should be obtained, particularly through proactive engagement letter provisions that anticipate a successor/caretaker arrangement, so transitions can happen quickly and ethically when time matters most.
